## Mifflin County Private Water Supply Testing Program

**May 12, 3:00pm-4:00pm or 7:00pm-8:00pm (Choose one)**

*Limited number of no-cost water tests available on first come first serve basis*

**A special opportunity for only Mifflin county households with their own well, spring or cistern.**

To participate you must commit to:

- Attend one-hour webinar on May 12 (3pm-4pm or 7pm-8pm session) where you will learn
  - How to protect your water supply
  - Why you should test your drinking water
  - How to collect a drinking water sample
- Commit to picking up sample bottles on May 13, collecting water sample, and returning bottles on May 14.
- Bottle pick up and return location is the parking lot behind the Mifflin County Conservation District. Address, 20 Windmill Hill in Burnham PA 17009.
- Bottle pick up is between Noon and 2pm, May 13.
- Bottle return is between Noon and 2pm, May 14.

You can remain in your car to pick up and drop off bottles.

Testing includes bacteria, pH, nitrate, manganese, lead, copper, and arsenic.

To qualify for water testing you must have a primary residence in Mifflin County (no camps or summer homes) with a private well, spring, or cistern.
